

2017 CATASTROPHIC INJURIES STATISTICS

CTP AND CIS SCHEME (1 JULY 2016 TO 30 JUNE 2017)

The Catastrophic Injuries Support (CIS) scheme was introduced on 1 July 2016 to provide lifetime treatment, care and support to people catastrophically injured in car crashes in Western Australia where fault cannot be attributed to another driver.

In 2017, over 185 service providers delivered services funded by the Insurance Commission to people with catastrophic injuries in the CIS and Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurance schemes.

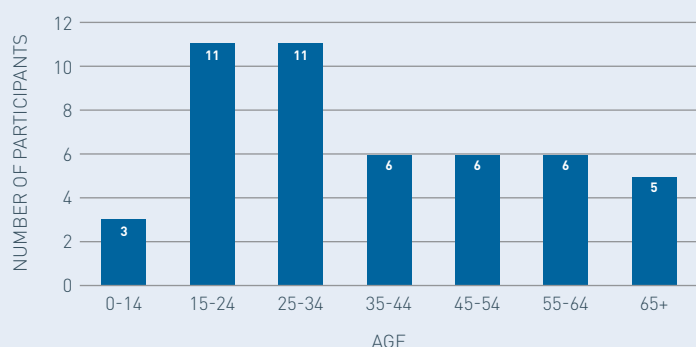

BUT ONLY **31%** OF PEOPLE CATASTROPHICALLY INJURED LIVE IN REGIONAL AREAS



THE AVERAGE COST OF LIFETIME TREATMENT, CARE AND SUPPORT WAS **HIGHER BY \$900,000 PER PERSON** (\$4.9 MILLION) COMPARED TO FORECASTS OF \$4 MILLION PER PERSON

THOSE CATASTROPHICALLY INJURED ON WA ROADS WERE **YOUNGER** IN 2017 COMPARED TO FORECASTS
