Motor Vehicle Catastrophic **Injuries Support Scheme Treatment, Care and Support**

Following your crash you may require ongoing treatment, care and support services. The Insurance Commission offers funding for necessary and reasonable services required for your crash related injuries. This fact sheet outlines how the Insurance Commission may be able to assist.

Treatment, care and support

Your treatment, care and support may include:

Ambulance Transport	Medical Treatment
Rehabilitation	Dental treatment
Domestic Assistance	Home and transport modifications
Education and vocational Training	Aids and appliances
Respite care Service	Attendant Care Services

Necessary and reasonable treatment, care and support

Necessary and reasonable treatment, care and support will be funded by the Insurance Commission if it:

- is designed to support you to maximise your independence;
- supports your capacity to undertake activities of daily living and enable you to participate in the community and/or employment;
- is evidence based and cost effective; and
- is delivered by a suitable provider.

What's not covered

Prostheses

- Services for injuries or medical conditions not related to your crash;
- compensation for economic loss, pain and suffering, and gratuitous care and support;
- property damage;
- costs associated with ordinary living (e.g. rent, household bills, car costs etc.);
- ordinary costs of raising a child;
- services provided by a person who is not a suitable provider; or
- treatment care and support provided outside of the Motor Vehicle (Catastrophic Injuries) Act 2016.
