

Medication Expenses

This fact sheet describes how the Insurance Commission can assist with your medication needs that relate to your crash injuries.

Medication Expenses

- The Insurance Commission will fund medication that is required for your crash related injuries.
- Medication must be prescribed by a doctor.
- We require a list of your medication (from your treating doctor or the hospital on discharge).

Reimbursement

- You will need to provide a copy of the receipt for your medication from the pharmacy to your claims officer. This should be sent via email.
- Reimbursement will be made directly into your bank account if you have provided those details.

Pharmacy Invoicing and Collection

- You can provide your claim number to your preferred pharmacy and they can invoice our office directly.
- We will provide the pharmacy with a list of pre-approved medications.
- Any changes to the list requires approval from the Insurance Commission and needs to be supported by a prescription from a doctor.
- If you are unable to pick up scripts directly from your Pharmacy, a home delivery option may be considered.

Note: The Insurance Commission does not routinely fund or support medication not funded by the Pharmaceutical Benefit Scheme such as vitamins, minerals and probiotics. Exceptions may be considered if:

- supported in writing by your treating medical specialist;
- · relate to your injuries sustained in the crash; and
- the prescribed items have scientifically validated therapeutic value.
