



Motor Vehicle (TPIF) Catastrophic Injuries Treatment, Care and Support

Following your crash you may require ongoing treatment, care and support services. The Insurance Commission offers funding for necessary and reasonable services required for your crash related injuries. This fact sheet outlines how the Insurance Commission may be able to assist.

Treatment, care and support

Your treatment, care and support may include:

Ambulance Transport

Rehabilitation

Domestic Assistance

Education and vocational Training

Respite care Service

Prostheses

Medical Treatment

Dental treatment

Home and transport modifications

Aids and appliances

Attendant Care Services

You may also be entitled to compensation for:

- past and future economic loss;
- compensation for pain and suffering;
- compensation for gratuitous care support; and
- case management expenses, if applicable.

Necessary and reasonable treatment, care and support

Necessary and reasonable treatment, care and support will be funded by the Insurance Commission if it:

- is designed to support you to maximise your independence;
- supports your capacity to undertake activities of daily living and enable you to participate in the community and/or employment;
- is evidence based and cost effective; and
- is delivered by a suitable provider.

What's not covered

- Services for injuries or medical conditions not related to the crash.
- Ordinary costs of living (e.g. rent, household bills, car costs etc).
- Ordinary costs of raising a child.
