



Education Support

Following your crash you may require various additional supports in continuing your education. This fact sheet has information on how the Insurance Commission can assist in education support.

Education Supports

The requirement of a client to receive assistance is identified by a medical professional and/or the school/education department who will contact the Commission to begin the process.

This process is reviewed on a needs basis and continues throughout the education years until identified as no longer required.

The following processes apply when you or your child are assessed as needing education support.

Education Assistant/Additional Teacher Days

- A Learning Support Form (Insurance Commission form) is completed by the school.
- The school provides documentation to support the application.
- The Insurance Commission will then consider the application and provide details of funding levels to the school, this is based on the requirement being related to the injuries sustained in the crash and incorporates the reasonable and necessary guidelines.

Tutoring

- The requirement for tutoring should be applied for and recommended on referral from a treating medical practitioner.
- The tutor/organisation should be accredited and appropriately trained to provide services as required.
- Funding will be considered on receipt of a quote, using the reasonable and necessary guidelines.
- The Insurance Commission will not fund untrained persons conducting this service.
