



Travel Expenses

Following your crash, it may not be possible to return to driving straight away or at all. This fact sheet provides information on available supports for travel.

Travel Information

The Insurance Commission can fund transport for rehabilitation or treatment related to your crash injuries.

The Insurance Commission may reimburse reasonable travel expenses to attend:

- Medical treatment;
- A medical examination arranged by the Insurance Commission
- An approved rehabilitation or disability service; and
- Work placements if you are unable to take public transport due to your injury.

Cab-charge E-tickets and Ride-Sharing

Cab-charge E-tickets may be available in limited circumstances where public transport is unavailable or unsuitable. Please note that:

- Only the injured person can use the ticket; and
- Unused tickets must be returned to the Insurance Commission.

Ride-sharing services such as Uber may be reimbursed, if supported by a receipt and explanation for the travel.

Private Vehicle

The Insurance Commission may reimburse private vehicle travel on submission of completed travel expenses log.

Reimbursement will be based on a set rate per kilometre in accordance with WorkCover WA published rates.

Parking fees may be reimbursed on submission of receipts which will need to include the date and explanation for the parking.
